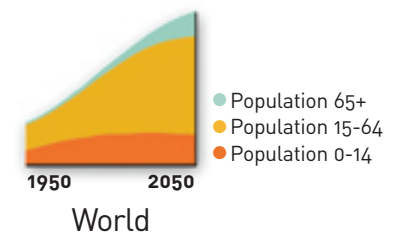
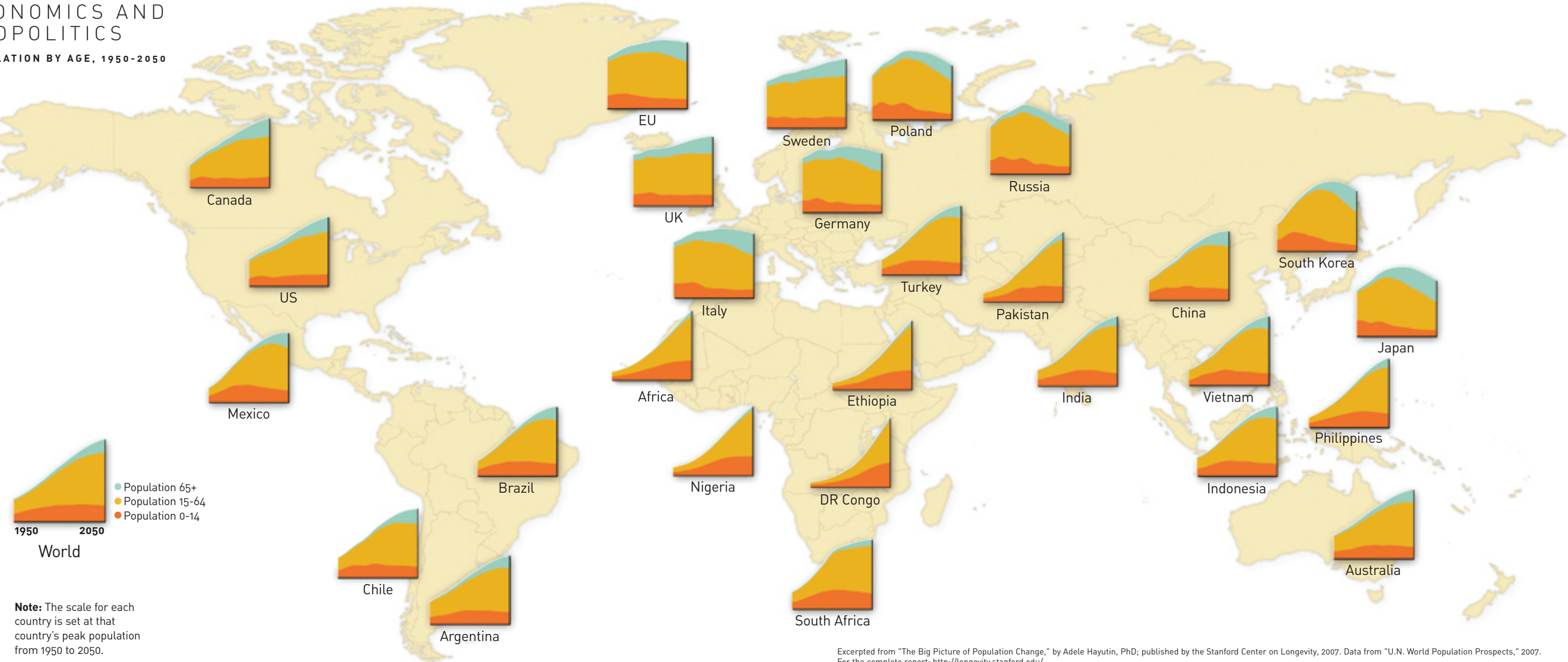


CHANGING AGE DISTRIBUTIONS WILL RE-SHAPE GLOBAL ECONOMICS AND GEOPOLITICS

POPULATION BY AGE, 1950-2050

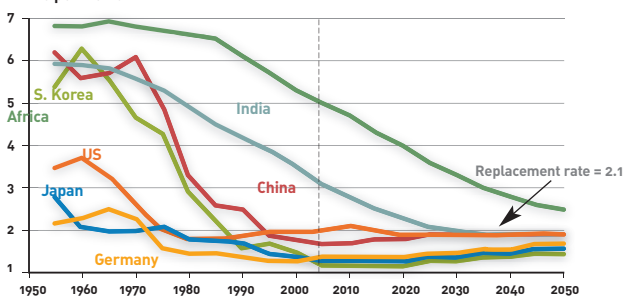


Note: The scale for each country is set at that country's peak population from 1950 to 2050.

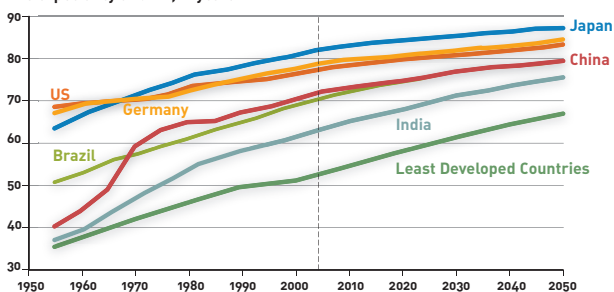
Steep fertility declines will result in rapid population aging.
